Biography

Jennifer Peterson represents plaintiffs and defendants in complex trial and appellate litigation. Over the course of her career, she has represented various clients, including local governments, a Fortune 50 retailer, professional services firms, hospitality entrepreneurs, and individual plaintiffs.

Outside the office, Jennifer is active in the Federalist Society, the Cobb County and Atlanta Bar Associations, the Georgia High School Mock Trial program, and her church.

Before joining the firm, Jennifer served as a law clerk to the Honorable William H. Pryor Jr. and the Honorable Elizabeth L. Branch of the U.S. Court of Appeals for the Eleventh Circuit.

Representative Matters

- Prevailed following oral argument in the U.S. Court of Appeals for the Eleventh Circuit on behalf of a Fortune 50 retailer in a lease dispute.
- Achieved victories in the Georgia Supreme Court for plaintiffs injured by medical negligence and criminal activity on unsecured premises.

- Secured dismissals of professional negligence and fraud claims against a respected regional law firm.
Won a seven-figure verdict for Fortune 50 retailer following bench trial of M&A dispute, and held verdict on appeal.
- Upheld on appeal a significant default judgment in favor of an injured worker.
- Prevailed on behalf of a Georgia hospital authority against claims of Open Meetings and Open Records Acts violations.
- Protected the trade secrets of a major building materials manufacturer through successful litigation, including securing a preliminary injunction from a federal court.
- Attained complete victory in a protracted LLC dispute by prosecuting multiple successful appeals, prevailing against non-meritorious claims, and obtaining an order that the wrongfully-appointed receiver reimburse millions in fees.
- Served as local counsel in national securities-fraud class action, resulting in highly favorable settlement for class.
- Provided pro bono assistance to individuals asserting religious-liberty claims.
